CANADIAN HISTORICAL TRIVIA

QUILTING AROUND ONTARIO IN JUNE

The flag of Nunavut features a red inuksuk and a blue star, which represents the North Star. The blue and yellow represent the land, sea and sky.

The flag of Ontario features an adapted Royal Union Flag and the Ontario shield of arms. It was created in 1965 after the introduction of the new Canadian flag from the Canadian Red Ensign which had served as Canada's flag but never officially adopted by parliament.

The Yukon flag is divided into three coloured panels, green represents the forests, white the snow and blue the lakes and rivers. In the centre is the Coat of Arms of Yukon and it is above a wreath of fireweed.

The Prince Edward Island flag consists of the English heraldic lion, an island on which appear three small oak saplings which represents the counties Prince, Queens, and Kings and a great oak tree which represents Great Britain.
