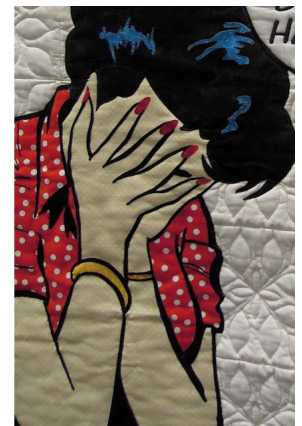


HIGHLIGHTS OF THE PACIFIC INTERNATIONAL QUILT FESTIVAL, October 26, 2016

Dottie's Lament, 45 x 44", by
Sue Bower, Pennsylvania, USA.

Sue explains about her original design: "This piece was inspired by [pop artist] [Roy Lichtenstein's](#) work. I created Dottie using multiple layers of fabric and raw edge machine applique. Her foundation pieced stash, custom digitized and machine embroidered dialogue balloon, and tone-on-tone longarm quilting preserve the 2D comic book look."

"The original scene appeared in the romance comic book series 'First Kiss', published in 1961. Did Brad really leave her? Stay tuned. The answer will be revealed in 2017."

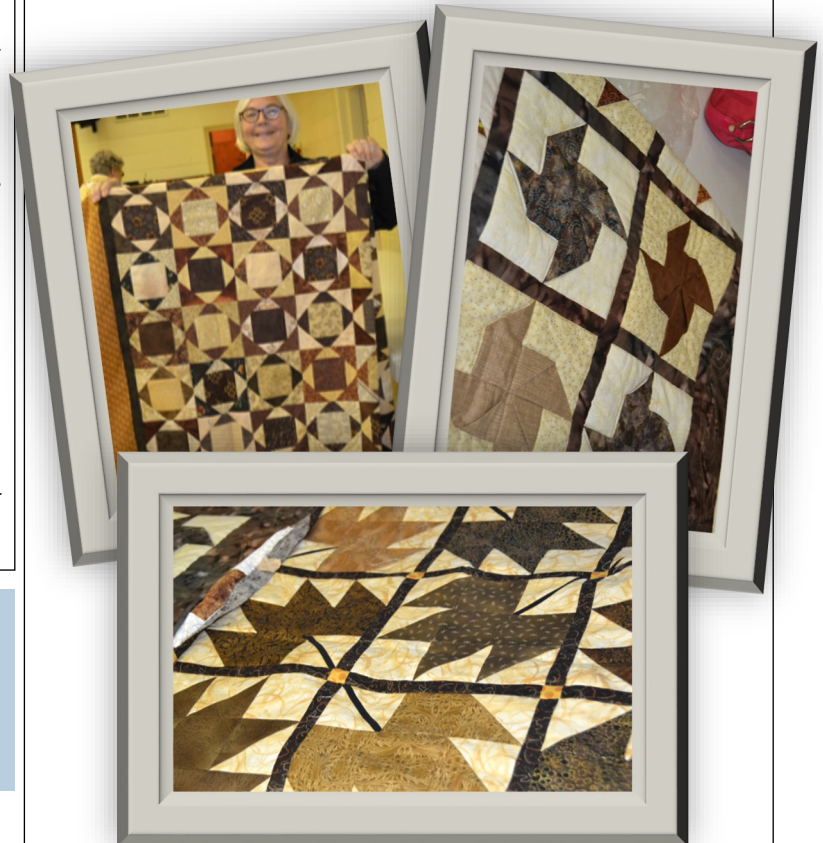


NOVEMBER CANADIAN "OLYMPIC" TRIVIA

- On December 10, 2009, Barbara Ann Scott delivered the Olympic Flag to Parliament Hill. She was the first North American to win all three major skating championships, the European, the worlds & the Olympics.
- On April 29, 1903 Dr. Emily Howard Stowe passed away. An avid activist for women's rights, she was the first female doctor to practice in Canada, also the first female principal of a public school in Upper Canada – Brantford's Central School.
- In September 1888, Archibald Stansfeld Belaney was born. He adopted the false First Nations identity of Grey Owl. A trapper turned conservationist, he wrote many articles and books. Upon his death, the revelation of his fake identity undermined his conservation efforts and publishers stopped publishing books under the name 'Grey Owl'.
- From February 19 to 20, 1958 Ellen Louks Fairclough of Hamilton became the Acting Prime Minister of Canada during Prime Minister John Diefenbaker's absence from Canada, the first woman ever to hold that role. She was also the first Canadian woman cabinet minister.

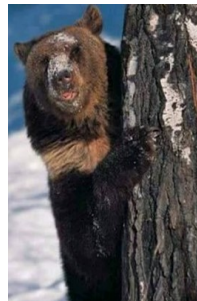
Before you hibernate, you're supposed to eat yourself stupid. I could deal with that too.

Accommodations

Camp Trillium in Waterford is in a beautiful forested area with a small lake. The sleeping cabins are separate from the meeting areas. They are very rustic with single bunk beds. Each semi-detached cabin has three bedrooms and a full bath and a powder room. You can drive up to the door to unload your gear. There are ramps into each cabin as well as stairs. There are pictures on the website if you would like to check it out in advance.

rentals@camptrillium.com There will be a limited number of single rooms available.

You must bring your own bedding (pillows, sheets and quilts or sleeping bags) and towels.

Meals

You will have all meals included -lunch on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, breakfast on Saturday and Sunday and Dinner on Friday and Saturday.

If you have dietary concerns, please indicate on the registration form. We have to let the kitchen know 2 weeks in advance.

This is a totally peanut free camp. You must bring only packaged snacks that are clearly marked. It is not acceptable to bring goods that claim they may have come in contact with nuts. We will provide appropriate snacks throughout the day. Trust us!

Program

This is a UFO retreat. There will be a possible pattern provided in your folder which you will receive in February if you would prefer a weekend project. There will not be an instructor. You will also receive a block kit to prepare for the retreat.

Bring your hand work to attend a late night sewing circle if interested.

Merchant Market will be available on Friday after dinner and before wine and cheese reception

We are asking for donations for the silent and Aline style auctions. Half of the proceeds will go to Camp Trillium.

There will be three mini Workshops offered. You may choose to participate in none, one, two or all three.

A. Friday afternoon – Needle turned appliqué

With **Roseline Dufour**

Roseline will bring most of the supplies to immerse you in hand worked appliqué. Most have seen her amazing work and many will be interested in attempting this technique. Bring a square of background fabric and hand sewing supplies and Roseline will provide the rest of the supplies.

B. Saturday morning – Paper piecing - add a quarter ruler – 3

With **Joanne Beard**

Joanne will prepare small kits of fabric and patterns to learn this technique quickly. You will need your sewing machine, basic sewing supplies and bring an add-a-quarter ruler if you already have one. There will be some available for sharing.

C. Saturday afternoon – Strip tube technique

With **Cathy Eagles**

Cathy will introduce the strip tube technique using strips and a 6 ½ inch square ruler. If you would like to make a lap quilt, you will need a jelly roll of 2 ½ inch strips (about 40) and ¾ of a yard of a light and a dark hued fabric) if you want to experiment with the technique but not make a quilt bring about 10 2 ½ inch strips
