## CANADA'S BIG QUILT BEE

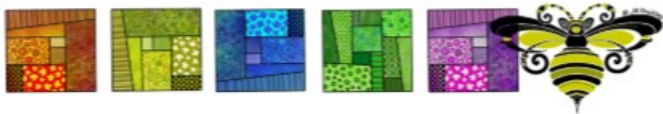
To celebrate Canada's 150th birthday we want you to be part of Canada's biggest Quilt Bee!
