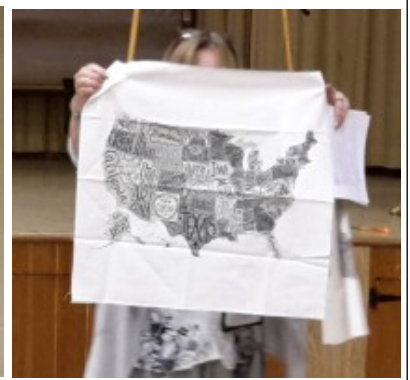

***Just a few notes from your OUTREACH COMMITTEE***

- ⇒ A gentle reminder that we are still accepting mug rugs which we will donate to Meals on Wheels in December.

As a guild, we will make blocks and then build four Tribute Quilts to honour those members who have passed away. These quilts will represent our respect and appreciation of our past members' contributions to the guild and community. The quilts will go through Outreach to worthy destinations.

Kits, with instructions plus a red fabric square, were distributed at the May guild meeting. There will be more kits available in June for those members, both new members and longstanding members, who did not receive one.

There will also be extra squares of red fabric available. Please use these red fabric squares rather than your own red substitute.

Bring your block, which will be 12 inches unfinished, to the September guild meeting. Do not trim your block. At that time, you will find out about the next steps needed to build our Tribute Quilts.

EXCITING OPPORTUNITY!



2020 CQA/ACC Member Guild Challenge

Calling all member guilds! Here is the news about the exciting challenge for next year. CQA/ACC wants to share everyone's sense of adventure as *Quilt Canada* travels north to Edmonton, AB! Join in the fun with your guild—your quilt could end up at *Quilt Canada 2020!*

Once individual quilts are made, each CQA/ACC member guild will select only one winner from their guild's membership before April 15, 2020, for entry into this challenge. All entries must follow the guidelines below.

- Open to CQA/ACC member guilds.
- Guilds wishing to enter the challenge must advise their intent to enter via email to Heather Black, h_nblack@sympatico.ca by March 1, 2020, so space allocation for display at *Quilt Canada 2020* can be arranged.
- Once the guild selects the quilt to represent their guild, the online entry form must be filled out and submitted by April 15, 2020. The online entry form will be located on the *Quilt Canada 2020* guild challenge page on www.canadianquilter.com. The form will be available March 1, 2020.
- Once the online entry form is received by CQA/ACC, a confirmation email with instructions for shipping the quilt will be sent to the guild email address supplied on the entry form.

THE CHALLENGE

THEME *Gateway to Adventure*

- Each quilt must have a visible amount of Kona® cotton, colour K001-147 Jungle, along with three (3) additional fabrics on the face of the quilt. The additional fabrics can be a print or solid.
- Quilt perimeter to be no larger than 72 inches.
- Each quilt must be finished with either binding, facings or enveloped pillow-case style.
- Must include a hanging sleeve, at least three inches wide, for display purposes.
- Must have a quilt label on back with quilt name and quilter's name visible on it.



- All quilts must be received by May 30, 2020, to be displayed at *Quilt Canada 2020*, June 18 to 20, at the Shaw Centre, Edmonton, AB.
- The winning quilt will be selected by Viewers' Choice ballot during *Quilt Canada 2020* and awarded a \$100 cash prize.
- All submitted quilts will remain in the possession of the CQA/ACC for approximately 11 months and will be returned to the owner/maker prior to *Quilt Canada 2021*.

CQA/ACC plans to tour these challenge quilts as part of a travelling show within Canada. Our Regional Representatives and/or Board directors will take the quilts to guilds and shops in their province to share the talents of our guild members.

Take up the challenge and set off on an adventure!

ORPHAN BLOCK CHALLENGE

'Between Expo' Challenge



Participants will bring an orphan block to the September meeting with the understanding that these blocks will not be returned to them. The blocks will be placed in a paper bag and handed out at random at the October meeting. Only those who brought a block to the September meeting will receive a bag with an orphan block inside. (Be sure to check that you didn't get your own block back.)

Using this block as a starting point, participants will create a quilted item of their choice that is no larger than 36 inches in any direction. It can be an article of clothing, an accessory (purse, bag, etc.), table topper, a wall hanging, or whatever you choose.

Your creation must be quilted and completely finished by the June meeting.

NOTE: The original orphan block should not be larger than 12 ½" (12.5") in any direction.

ITS IN THE BAG!BHQG BOM Program 2019

Program runs from September 2019 to June 2020.

Cost is \$10. Fee will partially cover the cost of fabrics and bag.

Each participant will be referred to as a BAGGER.

In June, each BAGGER will go home with a bag of 9 completed blocks of a particular theme and a label block.

This is a project designed for everyone. Sewing a themed block can be as simple as following a traditional pattern from a book or online pattern, to as complex as your creative imagination can take you. The theme and the fabrics will tie all the different blocks together in the end.

WHAT IS IN THE BAG?

- Starting in September, each participant will receive their first bag.
- Each bag will be named with a **different theme and numbered**.
- In the bag, there will be **1 yard of background fabric and one FQ** of a feature fabric representing the theme somehow.
- Also in each bag, there will be a **guideline sheet** including information where to find patterns and a cardboard **template size 9 1/2 in.**

WHAT DO YOU DO?

- Each BAGGER will make a **9 1/2 in. unfinished block following the theme** for that bag. Use the Cardboard template as a guide for sizing.
- The block may be made with any technique (hand or machine pieced, paper pieced, appliqué, etc.). Fusible appliqué is allowed but all raw edges must be satin stitched or blanket stitched by hand or machine.
- Each BAGGER will **return their bag with their new block to the BOM** organizing team at the next guild meeting. The Bags will be prepared for the next rotation by checking that fabrics are enclosed and the guidelines are being followed.
- Size matters. If your unfinished block is not the appropriate size, you will be asked to take your block back home and correct the measurements.
- Each BAGGER will **go home with a new themed Bag to work with.**

MAKE A LABEL BLOCK

- **In the first month, the additional task is to make a label block.**
- Please make sure there's enough space for 9 signatures on the label as each BAGGER is to sign the label. You may use a permanent marker or thread or any other method as long as it is **permanent**.
- Each month, the BAGGER will sign the label, number their signature and write the number in the **seam allowance of their block.**

OTHER INFORMATION

- Please use only **100% cotton fabrics**.
- Only leave the 2 supplied fabrics in the box. Other participants may be confused if there are more than the 2 fabrics supplied.
- **A piece of the Fat Quarter must be in every block.** Also every block must have the background fabric as border/background or as part of the design. Please leave enough of the fat quarter so everyone will have some for their block.

FINES and COUPONS

- Your block must be completed in the month that you have the box. If you do not, or if your block is not complete, there will be a \$10.00 fine. This \$10.00 goes into the bag.
- The BOM organizing team will **collect this fine and insert a coupon** in the bag to be reimbursed by the person who will be a block short at the end of the program.
- During the program, **anyone can redeem coupons** found in the bags by simply making an additional block of the bag theme.
- **You are responsible for keeping your bag in the rotation** and you must return it on time. If you can't make it to the meeting, send your bag with a friend or a member of the BOM team. The other BAGGERS are counting on you.

WHAT ABOUT THE SNOWBIRDS?

- Snowbirds will be able to drop out of rotation while away. Keep making monthly blocks of the same theme and then rejoin the rotation on return.
