Haldimand Quilters Guild Meeting Minutes – April 1, 2024


Shirley Kellar called the meeting to order at 6:35 pm at the Hagersville United Church with 24 Members present.

- 1. The Meeting Minutes from March 4, 2024 were accepted by a motion from Nadine, seconded by Ida. Carried.
- 2. Our donations to the West Haldimand General Hospital Foundation were discussed. One was started on our March Sew Day. We will need 7 strips 4" x WOF in bright hues of colours: Pink, Blue, Purple, Orange, Yellow, Green, Aqua. These fabrics could be a tiny print, tone-on-tone or marbleized. We also need black-on-white prints, as well as white-on- black prints.
- 3. For the Golf Tournament in September, Kathy suggested a wall hanging of fall leaves. She has a pattern that we could use. It is 48" x 49". Kathy will get background fabric and kits put together for those who can't make it to Sew Day. A motion to spend approximately \$75 for background was made by Debbie, seconded by Nadine. Carried.
- 4. Treasurer's Report: \$5,003.09 currently.
- 5. Our June Workshop will be on String Quilts. There are 9 members signed up so far. Shirley needs to know how many to expect, so we book the appropriate room to accommodate the sewing machines. Please let Shirley know as soon as possible.
- 6. Anne thanked all the participants for the Tissue Box Challenge. After the blocks were displayed, all the participants agreed to donate these blocks to the Guild. Anne made the participants small cases that would hold our glasses or rotary cutters. Thank you to Anne, what a lovely surprise!
- 7. Our Walk-Around-Haldimand total inches were not available for this meeting. Our finished inches were handed in to Kathy for details to be announced at a later date.
- 8. Kathy's BOM we have done September and October, so we just have November and December to have ready for next month. If you have any questions or need the patterns, please contact Kathy Hird.
- 9. Tricia's BOM none of the participants had their blocks with them for this meeting. We can admire these blocks at the next meeting.
- 10. Our Christmas Dinner was discussed. Maureen, our usual caterer, has retired. Shirley has asked the ladies at HUC to cater, and they agreed. Probably will be less choice, but reasonably priced.
- 11. Show & Share from Casey, Sherra, Nadine, Janice and Betty. We also saw 4 of the barn quilt painted wooden pieces done last month. Everyone is asked to bring them for the June meeting.
- 12. Community Outreach Draw was won by Ida, Terri, Sherra, Rita, and Susan.
- 13. Our Program was arranging our 2-1/2 x 4-1/2" potato chip pieces into different layouts. (They are called potato chip blocks because it is very hard to have just one). A lot of different possibilities were demonstrated, so it got our creative juices running. Please bring your 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" potato chip blocks what we brought to the meeting, to Sew Day to explore more possibilities with this very versatile size in different arrangements.
- 14. Our next Sew Day will be April 15th, 9:30 AM for more potato chip fun, working on our WHGH donations projects, or what you are currently working on. We will have a potluck lunch.
- Adjournment: Our next meeting will be on May 6, 2024, at 6:30 PM at the Hagersville United Church. We closed our meeting at 8:45 pm.




