using a scrunched up piece of Saran Wrap, two coordinating ink pads and spritzing water - lots of it - onto the inked Saran wrap. A piece of white Card stock was pressed upside down onto the inked Saran wrap and Ta Da -- we had a beautiful piece of background paper.
