Flashback to our January Meeting

Greeters: Barb Carlton and Joanne MacInnon.

Guest speaker was the Honourable Dave Levac, Speaker, Legislative Assembly of Ontario. He is a Liberal member of the Legislative Assembly of Ontario who was elected in 1999. He represents the riding of Brant.



Mr. Levac discussed his role as Speaker including his various duties. The Speaker is elected from among the MPPs shortly after a general election, and upon taking the chair, is not allowed to take part in debates and only votes in the case of a tie.

While in the Chamber, the Speaker wears a traditional uniform consisting of a long black robe, white shirt, and a three-cornered hat known as the tricorn.

The Speaker presides over the debates from a throne-like chair in the Legislative Chamber, maintaining order and advising the Members of Provincial Parliament (MPPs) about the rules of the House.

He described the Mace, which symbolizes the authority of the Speaker to oversee the Legislature and is carried into the meetings of Parliament by the Sergeant-at-Arms. The Assembly is not in session until the Mace is presented to the Speaker by the Sergeant at Arms.
