"April Showers Bring May Flowers"



Spring has Sprung and Rhonda Bennitt's trunk show tonight fits the season perfectly. April is the time of renewal and new growth and in the spirit of renewal, Rhonda's stunning work is often created using old treasures she finds while 'thrift diving'. Rhonda has a passion for preserving old pieces of needlework and making old things new again. She combines bits of lace, doilies, embroidered pieces, crewel-work, cross-stitched pieces and



tapestries into her creations. It is her way of saving old needlework and connects her to the stitchers of the past. Although interested in the old, she keeps abreast of new advances in the modern quilt world.

Rhonda is not a traditional quilter. She is self-taught and does not usually follow a pattern. She works mostly from the ideas she sees in her mind's eye and this challenges her to learn the new skills and techniques needed for her designs. In a few short years, she has mastered thread-painting, free-motion quilting, appliqué collage, and the use of Intense ink in her creations. She is currently learning how to use Angelina fibres so she can enhance her quilts with sparkle. She enjoys exploring all aspects of quilting. To Rhonda, there are no boundaries where quilting is concerned. It can lead anywhere.

Rhonda has a strong desire to help other quilters explore and expand their quilting horizons.

*Spring is April's way of saying "Let's Bloom"*. It is obvious that Rhonda is blooming where she is planted and spreading seeds of inspiration for others to follow. This is a trunk show you won't want to miss!!





### PRESIDENT'S CHALLENGE 2024 SCRAPPY BLOCKS

#### Each kit contains:

Scrappy material ~ 16 - 2 1/2" squares

White tones - 1 (4 1/2" x 4 1/2") square

- 2 (4 1/2" x 2 1/2") rectangles

- 2 (8 1/2" x 2 1/2") rectangles


#### Block A

- 1. Sew together two rows of 4 scrappy squares. Press the outside squares towards the middle. The centre seam just press flat.
- 2. Sew together two rows of 2 scrappy squares.
- 3. Sew 2 squares on either side of the  $4\,\%''$  square. Press seam towards scrappy fabric.
- Sew one 4-patch strip to either side of the white square. Press seam towards the scrappy fabric.

#### Block B

- 1. Make a four patch square with the remaining 2 1/2" squares.
- 2. Sew the two 2 1/2" by 4 1/2" strips to either side of the four patch. Press towards scrappy fabric.
- 3. Sew the two 2 1/2" by 8 1/2" strips to the other two sides of the four-patch. Press towards the scrappy fabric.

If you would like to make more blocks of this design to donate to outreach, use up some of your scraps.
