admits that she 'eats, sleeps, and breathes quilting'. Her work is unique and clearly reflects her love of using Japanese cotton fabrics with her *Complex Curves techniques*.

Patricia will be of great interest to our modern and 'improv' quilters or those who enjoy using hand-dyed and beautiful Japanese fabrics. On one of her many trips to Japan, Patricia discovered vintage yukata cottons. These hand-dyed fabrics with graphic patterns and rich colours are ideal for making her striking quilts.

Patricia's presentation, Spirit Quilts, When a Quilt is More

than a Quilt will touch your heart and open your eyes to a new way of making memory quilts. Her memory quilts are works of art which combine pieces of clothing that hold meaning to the recipient with yukata cotton and Japanese fabrics.



Patricia co-owns Okan Arts with her daughter Victoria. Okan Arts

is a cottage business that **imports vintage Japanese textiles**. **You may find the shop at** https://okanarts.com Patricia is the author of *East Meets West Quilts*. Her book explains how to combine the yukata cottons with commercial solids to make a series of improv quilts. This book would be of great interest to our modern quilters.
