

There will be lots of laughter, time to catch up with friends, and interesting


things to see and learn.



Title: Finesse your Quilt Workshop

Date: Saturday March 16, 2024

Time: 9:30 am - 3:30 pm

Location: Gaukel Memorial Community Center – 7 Gaukel Dr. St George

Learn how to put the finishing touches on your quilt.

This is a hands on workshop about bindings and borders. We will cover:

-the difference between a straight binding and a bias binding;

- when to use them and how to make

-how to finish by machine with a neat row of stitches on the reverse exactly where you want them to be

-how to make a flange binding

- ♦ You will learn the ratios that create pleasing borders to determine the width of each border section
- ♦ have a multitude of creative options for borders if you want something more than just a strip of fabric.

There are lots of handouts so you will have resources to refer to when you are home.

Don't wait until the March meeting to sign up. Give yourself time to do the prep work!

What is the most famous quilt in the world?

The 1863 Jane Stickle Quilt, in Vermont USA

The quilt that inspires quilters all over the world will be on its yearly display at the Bennington Museum from Labour Day through Indigenous People's Day.

Brought to the museum over 80 years ago, the Jane Stickle Quilt is only shown for a short time each year due to the fragility of the fabric. Quilters from around the country, and world, plan trips to the region during that time to see the 1863 quilt. The Jane Stickle Quilt is comprised of 169 five-inch blocks, each in different patterns, containing a remarkable total of 5,602 pieces surrounded by a unique scalloped border. The craftsmanship of the quilt has been mentioned in numerous quilting books, and is the topic of *Dear Jane, The Two Hundred Twenty-Five Patterns from the 1863 Jane A. Stickle Quilt, by Brenda Papadakis*.
